RI formally approved the "Rotary on Pins" Fellowship on April 29, 2016.

Our Fellowship's purpose is:

Engage Rotary through Rotary pins.

Share, collect, highlight and trade pins affiliated with Rotary.

Rotary Fellowships – The ABC's

Rotary Fellowships are international, independently organized groups of Rotarians, Rotarian spouses, and Rotaractors who share a common vocation or recreational interest.

Rotary Fellowships give their members the opportunity to have fun, make new friends around the world, and enhance their experience in Rotary.

Rotary Fellowships began informally in 1928 when Rotarians with a shared interest in the international language Esperanto joined together.

In 1947, a group of Rotarian boating enthusiasts began flying the Rotary flag from their crafts, calling themselves the International Yachting Fellowship of Rotarians which now holds the distinction of being the oldest continuing fellowship.

The scope of fellowships has changed significantly over the years, but their purpose remains the same: to unite Rotarians in friendship and provide opportunities to enjoy favorite recreational or professional activities.

The (Very Brief) Rotary on Pins

Historical Timeline

How did this Fellowship start? Here is an abbreviated timeline recorded for posterity of the creation of the <u>Rotary on Pins</u> <u>Fellowship</u>.

March 2015 - D-6970 Rotarian (and current Fellowship Chair) **Ed Book**, a Rotary pin collector, researches fellowships.

May – Email to Rotary International results in RI fellowship liaison **Zuhal Sharp** providing guidance.

June-July – Recruitment via emails and messages to Rotary clubs worldwide. August – Facebook page created. Also, District Governor **Fel Lee** agrees to have D-6970 support it and assigns Past District Governor (current Fellowship Board member) **Wes Eubank** as the liaison.

August – Internationally known Rotarian **Evan Burrell** joins the proposed board along with **Keith Nickol** from the UK.

October – Draft by-laws and membership information sent to RI.

November – Rotary on Pins "Group" created under MyRotary.org November 22 – Application to RI with by-laws, board, and a Founders membership list representing 38 members in 16 countries. (See Founders list page 3)

December 2015 – Rotary Board of Fellowships tentatively approves. Rotary on Pins to be voted on by RI Board of Directors in April, 2016.

April 29, 2016 – RI emails confirming International recognition of the Rotary on Pins Fellowship.

May – Rotary on Pins Fellowship participates in D-6970 conference House of Friendship.

Was there an earlier version of a Rotary pin fellowship before Rotary on Pins? Why yes, it appears there was...

A similar previous version of this was called the *International Pin Collecting Fellowship of Rotarians.*

The pin depicting it was split with "We collect pins," "Pin Pals," and the Rotary wheel in each of 3 sections.

The Rotarian magazine depicts some of this fellowship's history.

The September 1991 issue of <u>The Rotarian</u> wrote that Rotarian Leon Marx of Metairie, Lousiana, US was chartering this fellowship with 39 members. He was recruiting at the RI convention in Mexico City.

This fellowship was approved and a pin created.

Alas, by May 2003, this fellowship was terminated along with 5 others as reported in the September 2003 issue of <u>The Rotarian</u>. More history will be reported later about this forefather or at least distant cousin of the Rotary on Pins Fellowship.
